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Fee Increases

Land Titles Office

Since 2010 LTO registration fees have been expressed in revenue units in the Registration Regulations. On 1 July 2012, the value of each revenue unit for the 2012/13 financial year will increase to \$1.05. This will give rise to a number of fee increases, including:

Standard Lodgement	\$109.00
Non Standard Lodgement	\$162.00
Caveat	\$194.00
Power of Attorney	\$ 99.00

Electronic Conveyancing

The establishment of National E-Conveyancing is an initiative of the Council of Australian Governments (COAG) to provide a single national electronic conveyancing system for use throughout Australia.

The Australian Registrars' National Electronic Conveyancing Council (ARNECC) was created to ensure a consistent national approach in the regulation of National E-Conveyancing.

Proposed Electronic Conveyancing National Law

This paper introduces an exposure draft of the Proposed Electronic Conveyancing National Law that will be an integral part of the Legal Framework being developed by the States and Territories for National Electronic Conveyancing.

Proposed Model Participation Rules

This is the draft of the proposed Model Participation Rules which form part of the legal framework being developed by the States and Territories and outlines the rules for the subscriber for participating in National Electronic Conveyancing. For example the eligibility criteria for subscribers, obligations of subscribers, client authorisations and certification of registry instruments.

Proposed Model Operating Requirements

This introduces an exposure draft of the proposed Model Operating Requirements which form part of the legal framework. The operating requirements include provisions relating to the financial standing of the Electronic Lodgement Network Operator (ELNO), compliance with the participation rules, the technical and operational requirements of an Electronic Lodgement Network (ELN), Insurance cover to be held by an ELNO, circumstances in which the Registrar may suspend or revoke the approval of a person as an ELNO and the giving of directions to an ELNO by the Registrar.

Data Verification of Deaths in the Births, Deaths & Marriages Office (BDM)

Data verification commenced in the second week of January and all deaths will be verified by the end June. A total of 4,000 deaths have been verified.
